

In 2006, Joseph and Marion Schasney made their first gift to the Foundation, a planned donation from a Charitable Annuity Trust that was paid out in 2018. This trust paid the Schasneys an income for the remainder of their lives and then made a gift of \$130,000 for pediatric research. After their initial gift, the Schasneys established an additional bequest to the Foundation through their living trust. This substantial bequest will tremendously impact the lives of children.

The Children's Hospital of Michigan Foundation fulfills our mission through awarding grants to organizations that provide services and programs to the children in our communities.





Precision Oncology in a Multi-Institutional, Multi-Ethnic Cohort of Children with High Risk Malignancies – Awarded \$592,101 Over Three Years

There is no goal more important and urgent than improving the outlook for young cancer patients. This award will help fund an ethnically-diverse study to further understand responses to cancer immunotherapy treatments in minority children. The University of Michigan and Children's Hospital of Michigan in collaboration with the partners listed to the left will work together on this noble endeavor.

"Every year 16,000 new cases of pediatric cancer are diagnosed in the U.S. Over the last 40 years, with scientific progress, we are now able to cure 70-75% of these children. However, the Foundation's support is extremely critical in the development of new, high-risk research studies to develop preliminary data to help the remaining 25-30% of patients that do not respond to current treatment."

Education transforms lives. Brilliant Detroit coordinates programs and workshops that help kids ages 0-8 to be "school ready", healthy and stable. This grant enabled us to renovate a new location in Detroit's Springwells neighborhood to impact child health and nutrition, as well as addressing the interpersonal and cultural influences that impact the social conditions in which children live.

The Connect Today! program at the Boys & Girls Clubs of Oakland and Macomb Counties addresses the behavior and anxiety challenges that affect many of our youth today. The program focuses on coping skills and family support. Thanks to this grant, Connect Today! will launch this delivery model by supporting two licensed, professional therapists and a program coordinator to provide therapy sessions for families in Oakland and Macomb Counties.

\$100,000

Children from neighborhoods affected by poverty, crime, and substance abuse typically face more serious and traumatic health issues with fewer treatment options. Beaumont's seven school-based health centers serve the medical needs of this highrisk youth population. The goal of this "challenge" grant, in partnership with Beaumont and Children's Hospital of Michigan Foundation, is to raise \$50,000 each in efforts to support responsive and comprehensive behavioral health services at the Beaumont Teen Health Center - River Rouge.



"The grant funding we received will allow us to provide social work, mental health counseling and therapy to the students of River Rouge High School as well as students throughout Southeastern Michigan ages 10-21. The funding will provide the ability to assess and treat these students as well as focus on mental health and wellness."




