ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA & SELECTION PROCESS



In alignment with the reopening of Michigan Central Station, Bill and Lisa Ford established the Michigan Central Station Children's Endowment Initiative in partnership with the Children's Foundation. Initial seed funding of \$500,000 will allow ten youth-serving organizations to start or grow an endowment and the opportunity for each organization to establish a \$1.5 million endowment within two years. The ten organizations will be selected through a transparent and equity-driven process.

WHAT IS A "YOUTH-SERVING ORGANIZATION"?

The Michigan Central Station Children's Endowment Initiative defines a "youth-serving organization" as a 501(c)3 organization based in Michigan that provides health (physical, dental and mental, etc.), educational, support, cultural, recreational, and social programs or services to persons from 0 to 24 years old and their parents, family, caregivers or guardians.








Philanthropic revenue is revenue from the charitable giving of private entities (individuals, corporations, foundations, bequests, events, etc.).

Importantly, it does not include earned revenue for services provided and excludes grant dollars from public entities (federal, state, or local).

Information for Regional & National Organizations

Regional and national organizations with a local affiliate can apply, however, preference will be given to local affiliates that have an EIN separate from the larger organization and an independent board of directors. Local affiliates of national organizations should ensure that their application materials reflect only local operations.

This is because the endowment initiative is for Detroit area organizations, and we want to support organizations without access to the infrastructure and resource capacity of a broader network.

- IRS Form-990 for the last two years (2022 and 2023 or 2021 and 2022)
- · Most recent audited financial statement
- · Most recent annual report
- List of Board Members that includes their Board Committee membership and professional affiliations (this may be part of the organization's annual report. If not, submit a separate document)
